Six multi-service Settlement Houses are working together to bring Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) to NYC's HARP members in and near Manhattan.

The participating organizations are:

Goddard Riverside Community Center, Greenwich House, Henry Street Settlement, Lenox Hill Neighborhood House, Union Settlement, and University Settlement/The Door.

Services for HARP members

Tier I services focus on employment and include:

- Employment support services, including pre-vocational services, intensive supported employment, education services, and ongoing supportive employment services
- Peer supports

Tier II services address all aspects of recovery and include:

- Psychosocial rehabilitation
- Habilitation
- Peer supports
- Family support & training
- Education & employment services
